

Kitchen Worktop Measurement Guide

This guide is designed to help you measure your kitchen worktops accurately. Fill in the sections below as you measure to ensure a perfect fit for your worktop. Remember to measure twice and note down everything clearly. If in doubt, consult a professional to verify your measurements.

Step 1: Gather Your Tools

Ensure you have the following tools before you begin measuring:

- Measuring tape (at least 5 metres)
- Pencil or marker
- Notepad or digital device for taking notes
- Straightedge or ruler
- Spirit level (optional but recommended)

Step 2: Measure Your Kitchen Worktops
